4 Constitutional referendum procedure; form of 5 question; effective date. Resolved: That the city 6 aldermen, town selectmen and plantation assessors of 7 this State shall notify the inhabitants of their re-8 spective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide 9 10 election, at the next general election in the month 11 of November following passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed 12 13 in this resolution by voting upon the following ques-14 tion:

15 "Shall the Constitution of Maine be amended 16 proposed by the Legislature to provide that, as 17 beginning with the property tax year 1984, all 18 watercraft as defined by the Legislature shall be from taxation as personal property, pro-19 exempt 20 vided that certain watercraft as defined by the 21 Legislature shall be subject to an excise tax to 22 be collected and retained by the municipalities?"

23 The legal voters of each city, town and 24 plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and 25 shall designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word 26 "Yes" or "No." 27 The ballots shall be received, 28 sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and 29 plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary State in the same manner as votes for members of 30 of 31 the Legislature. The Governor shall review the re-32 turns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal 33 votes are in favor of the amendment, the Governor 34 shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amend-35 ment shall become part of the Constitution on the 36 date of the proclamation.

37 Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Re-38 solved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare 39 and furnish to each city, town and plantation all 40 ballots, returns and copies of this resolution neces-41 sary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

5	sonal property, provided that certain watercraft as
6	defined by the Legislature shall be subject to an ex-
