3 4 5	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
6 7 8 9 0	Whereas, a study group on sardine processing wastewater was established by the First Regular Session of the 111th Legislature and was required to report its recommendations to the Second Regular Session of the 111th Legislature by a certain deadline; and
2 3 4 5	Whereas, it has become apparent that the study group has been unable to develop acceptable wastewater standards and thus the group will require additional time to complete its report and make its recommendations; and

- Whereas, the Legislature requires the fully considered recommendations of the group in order to make informed decisions on pending matters; and
- Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
- 10 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 11 follows:

- 3. Study. The commissioner, in cooperation with the sardine industry, shall conduct a study of the Maine sardine industry. This study shall consider:
- 17 A. Initiation of a program to ensure quality control of industry monitoring data;
- 19 B. Other data necessary to establish effluent 20 standards;
- C. Current or proposed federal categorization and effluent limitations for the sardine industry, and their relation to practices in Maine; and
- D. Determination of best practicable control technology currently available for the sardine industry, including the performance and availability of control technology, the economic impact of the implementation of this technology and any other issues deemed relevant.
- The commissioner shall submit this report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over marine resources by February 29734 April 11, 1984.
