- 5 Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §10903, as enacted by PL 1981, 6 c. 693, §§5 and 8, is amended to read:

## §10903. State agency

The university <u>system</u> shall be an instrumentality and agency of the State for the purpose for which it was established and for which it has been managed and maintained under Private and Special Law 1865, chapter 532, and related supplementary legislation.

- Sec. 3. 20-A MRSA §10904, sub-§§1 and 2, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 693, §§5 and 8, are amended to
  read:
  - 1. Accounting. Endowment, trust and other non-expendable funds for investment held by the trustees, which have been or may be created and established by private donors for the benefit of a university or the university system or for any purpose directly related to the activities of the university, shall be preserved in their several separate identities in the books of account of the university system and administered according to the terms of the gifts.
  - 2. Management of individual funds. For the purpose of investment only, and in order to afford to each fund the advantage of a diversification of risk wider than can be obtained by preserving the investment unity of each fund, and in the absence of any conditions or restrictions to the contrary made by the donor, the system trustees may combine, pool and merge these funds with other similar funds. The system trustees shall account for profits, losses and income to each individual fund in the proportion which its value bears to the total value of the merged fund as of the date of merger.
- 37 Sec. 4. 20-A MRSA §10905, as enacted by PL 1981, 38 c. 693, §§5 and 8, is amended to read:

## 1 §10905. Treasurer; compensation

- The <u>system</u> trustees shall appoint a full-time treasurer of the university. The treasurer shall give bond for the faithful performance of his duties in an amount and with such conditions and sureties as the <u>system</u> trustees may determine. The compensation of the treasurer shall be set by the trustees.

- Section 3. The Governor and council shall at all times have the power, by themselves himself, or such committee as they he shall appoint to examine into affairs of the college, and the doings of the trustees, and to inspect all their records and acthe buildings and premises occupied by and the college. Whenever the Governor and council shall have reason to believe that the trustees are exercising or attempting to exercise any unlawful powers, or unlawfully omitting to perform any legal duty, may direct the Attorney General to institute process against the trustees in their corporate capacity, the nature of a complaint in equity before the Supreme Judicial Court, in the county in which the college may be established, and the court after notice, shall hear and determine the same, by summary proceeding in term time, or by any judge in vacation, and may make any suitable decree, restraining the trustees from performing or continuing the unlawful acts complained of, for requiring them to perform whatever is unlawfully omitted, and may enforce In like manner a complaint may be instidecrees. tuted against any individual trustee, and be heard in the county where he resides, alleging against him any cause deemed by the Governor and council sufficient to disqualify him for the trust; and if in the judg-ment of the court such allegation shall be sustained, a decree shall be made removing such trustee from office, and his place shall be thereby vacated.

- A. The combined membership of the Boards of Trustees of the University of Maine and the University of Southern Maine; and
  - B. The Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services who shall serve ex officio, act as chairman and vote to break a tie.
- 2. Board of Trustees of the University of Maine and the Board of Trustees of the University of Southern Maine. The Board of Trustees of the University of Maine and the Board of Trustees of the University of Southern Maine shall have 7 members each.
  - A. Six members to each board shall be appointed for 5-year terms by the Governor, subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education and confirmation by the Legislature. Each term shall expire on May 26th of the appropriate year, except that the retiring member shall serve until a successor is appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Legislature. No person accepting an appointment may be a member of the State Board of Education. In making appointments, the Governor shall strive to achieve a membership which is representative of the population of this State. Insofar as feasible when selecting qualified nominees to the boards, the Governor shall consider the nominee's sex, professional education and experience and an equitable geographical representation among members. Trustees may serve a maximum of 2 terms, except that an individual appointed to fill an unexpired term of 3 years or less is eligible for appointment for 2 full terms. Vacancies shall be filled by the Governor, subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education and confirmation by the Legislature, for the unexpired balance of the term. In order to restore and maintain rotation of terms of office of trustees, an incumbent trustee who

- was appointed for a term of 5 years at a time subsequent to the expiration of the term of his predecessor in office shall be deemed to have commenced his 5-year term upon the date of the expiration of the term of office of his predecessor rather than from the date of his appointment and qualification. Trustees shall serve without compensation, but may be reimbursed for travel and other expenses incurred in the performance of their official duties.
  - One of the members of each board shall be full-time student at one campus of their University at the time of appointment and shall be a permanent resident of the State. To be eligible as a student member, a student must be enrolled for a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester. The student member shall be a full voting member of the Board of Trustees, and shall serve for a 2-year term and until a successor is qualified. The Governor shall nominate the student member from a list of 5 eligible students submitted by the University of Maine and the University of Southern Maine organization of student govern-The nomination shall be made within 30 ments. days of receiving the list of names and shall subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education and confirmation by the Legislature. student representative shall not come from the same campus in any 2 consecutive terms.
  - C. The Board of Trustees shall meet from time to time at each of the various campuses of their university, whenever reasonably practical.

- 35 (1) The 2 university boards shall be 4 mem-36 bers; and
- 37 (2) The university system shall be 4 mem-38 bers of each university board.
  - E. Voting in the:
    - (1) Two university boards shall be a majority of those present and voting; and

- (2) University system shall be 2/3 of those present and voting.
- F. The 2 university boards and the system trustees may hire consultants or staff to help them carry out their duties.

- 3. Implementation. This section shall not affect the variety of appointments nor the length terms of the trustees appointed to the Board of Trustees prior to the effective date of this section, and each trustee shall continue to serve until the end of the term to which the individual was appointed. The Governor, with the approval of the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education, shall assign the 15 members of the present Board of Trustees as equally as possible to one or the other of the 2 new university boards of trustees. If one board has 8 members, it shall function as an 8-member board until one member's term expires or until one member resigns. Any vacancies occurring after the effective date of this section shall be filled in accordance with the provisions of this section. The first vacancy on the board without a student member shall be filled by a student.
- Sec. 10. P&SL 1865, c. 532, section 4-A, as enacted by P&SL 1967, c. 229, §3, is amended to read:

Section 4-A. Administration; university presidents; campus heads; administrative council; advisory committees. The Each board of trustees shall appoint a chanceller president of the their university who shall serve at its pleasure and be chief administrative and education officer thereof. The ehanceller Each president may maintain an office at Augusta and such other offices as the their board of trustees may designate. - 10 1. Boards of trustees; duties. The boards of 11 trustees of each university, in consultation with its 12 president, shall:
- 13 A. Be the governing and planning body of the 14 university;
- 15 B. Have the responsibility for preparing and ap-16 proving the operating and capital budgets of its university and present them to the university system board of trustees for approval. The sys-17 18 19 tem board shall present a unified budget in ac-20 cordance with the direction in the Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1665, and Title 5, chapter 21 22 153;
  - C. In consultation with the chief administrative officer of each campus and consistent with the overall plan for their university, develop a mission statement and a long-range plan for each campus. They shall review the mission statement and the long-range plan biannually;
- 29 D. Approve major academic policies developed by 30 the president, such as the addition or termination of academic programs, the standards for ad-31 32 mission and standards for receipt of degrees from 33 the campus;
- 34 E. Develop and implement criteria and policies 35 to assure excellence in programs, teaching and scholarship at the undergraduate and graduate 36 level; 37

F. Develop and implement criteria and policies to assure excellence in research at each of their campuses;

- G. Develop and implement criteria and policies to assure excellence in public service programs and activities provided by their campuses;
- H. Pursue on behalf of their campuses endowments, grants, gifts, contributions and other private funding support for the benefit of the campuses and their university; and
- I. Establish and maintain proper relations between their campuses and their programs and the public in order to serve the needs and interests of both.
- 2. Presidents and staff members; duties. The presidents shall exercise such powers and fulfill such responsibilities as shall be delegated by their boards. The presidents may delegate any of such powers and responsibilities to such members of their staff as they deem necessary.
  - 3. Head of each campus; duties. The head of each campus shall be the chief administrative and educational officer thereof. The chief administrative officer shall be responsible for the day to day operation and development of its academic program within the limits defined by their board of trustees and the president of their university; and in addition shall exercise such rights and privileges as are generally recognized in the administering of admissions, curriculum development, extra curricular programs, longrange planning within the framework of the overall university plan and supervision of faculty.
- 4. Administrative council. The administrative council shall exercise the following responsibilities: Make to their board of trustees, through their president, recommendations which require board action or pertain to policy development; serve as a clearinghouse for matters referred to it by appropriate officers of individual institutions; and act on matters referred to the council by their president or their board of trustees.

- Section 4-C1. Properties, assets and liabilities. Property of the university under section 4-C

  shall be retained by the University of Maine system.

  Any property, other gifts or income therefrom designated for a particular university or campus shall be allocated by the system trustees for use by that university or campus.

- Section 8-B. Appointment of faculty staff and policemen. Notwithstanding any other section, the president of each campus shall nominate and the trustees of each campus appoint faculty for the campuses of their university.
  - The trustees of each university, or such administrators of their university as the trustees may designate for this purpose, may appoint persons to act as policemen who shall, within the limits of the property owned by or under the control of the university, possess all of the powers of policemen in criminal cases and civil violations.
