## STATEMENT OF FACT

Due to a revaluation, the value of the Thomaston Cement Plant in Thomaston has been reduced by \$12,800,000. This change in valuation will not be reflected in state valuation until 2 years after the reduction. State funding for education is based upon state valuation and will not increase as a result of the valuation until 2 years after the change. This bill provides an immediate increase in state funding for education in the same amount that the town would receive if the state valuation was reduced immediately.

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
