28 29 30	1. <u>Certification</u> . A person must be certified by the commissioner under section 13002 this chapter or chapter 502 in order to:

6	§13011. General authorization of state board
7	1. Certification and revocation rules. All cer-
8	tificates issued or revoked after June 30, 1988,
9	shall be in accordance with this chapter. The state
10	board shall adopt rules to carry out the purposes of
11	this chapter under which the commissioner shall:
12	A. Certify teachers and other professional per-
13	sonnel for service in a public school or in an

15	cate is a renewable certificate issued to an individ-
16	ual who has held a preliminary certificate and has

20	icate shall require that the certificate may only be
21	issued to an applicant who, at a minimum:
22	A. Holds a preliminary teacher certificate or

Possesses a professional teacher certificate; B. Has demonstrated exemplary professional 14 15 skills in school-based experiences in classroom instruction and who may have additionally con-16 17 tributed to his profession in such areas as: 18 (1) Curriculum development; 19 (2) Teacher in-service training and effec-20 tive staff development; or 21 (3) Student-teacher supervision; and 22 C. Has obtained the support team's positive recommendation based on the contents of a teacher 23 action plan pursuant to section 13015. 24 25 3. Endorsements. The holder of a master teacher certificate shall possess, at a minimum, the endorse-26 27 ments held under the professional certificate. 4. Five-year certificate. A master teacher cer-28 29 tificate may be issued for a 5-year period and may be 30 renewed in accordance with section 13016. 5. Effective date. Notwithstanding the July 1, 31 1988, reference in section 13011, the state board 32 shall, prior to September 1986, draft rules governing 33 34 the issuance of master teacher certificates. Starting in September 1986, any teacher, who holds a 5-year or 35

5 §13015. Support system

6 1. Employment. No public school may employ a 7 preliminary teacher unless it has an approved, local-8 ly designed, support system or has received specific 9 authorization from the commissioner in accordance 10 with state board rules.

- 11 <u>2. Purpose. The purpose of an approved support</u> 12 <u>system is to:</u>
- A. Provide strong support services for develop ing good teaching and classroom management skills
   to teachers with preliminary certificates;
- 16 B. Provide assistance and review to all individ-17 uals who are candidates for a higher level cer-18 tificate; and
- 19C. Assist all teachers in becoming better teach-20ers.

21 This support system is separate from local practices 22 and procedures regarding the evaluation of a teacher 23 for retention by an administrative unit. To the ex-24 tent possible, administrators responsible for employ-25 ment evaluation should not be part of that particular 26 teacher's support team.

3. Approval. Each administrative unit's support
system is subject to approval by the commissioner in
accordance with state board rules which shall require, at a minimum, that an approved support system
contains the following:

The teacher action plan shall describe the specific 16 17 skills which must be developed and improved by the 18 teacher, as well as any other requirements, which may include additional professional graduate and advanced 19 study, in order to achieve a positive recommendation 20 21 to receive a higher level of certificate. A teacher 22 action plan shall contain the basis for the positive 23 or negative recommendation of a support team as to whether a teacher should be granted a professional teacher certificate or a master teacher certificate, 24 25 26 as applicable. 5. Records confidential. A teacher action plan 27 shall be considered an employee record and shall be 28 kept confidential in accordance with sections 6101 29 30 and 6102. 31 §13016. Renewal of teacher certificates 32 Teacher certificates issued in accordance with 33 this chapter may be renewed pursuant to state board 34 rules which shall include, but not be limited to, the 35 following. 36 1. 20 The state board shall review teacher certificate 21 standards every 6 years and report the results of its 22 review to the Legislature, along with any proposed 23 legislation. The first report to the Legislature 24 shall be due starting with the legislative session 25 beginning in December 1990.

26 Sec. 5. Pilot project and report to the Second 27 Regular Session of the 112th Legislature. Notwith-28 standing the effective date set forth in the Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 13014, 29 subsection 4, 30 master teacher certificates may be issued as of July 1, 1985, to qualified individuals who have partici-31 32 pated in pilot projects designed to train individuals 33 to become master teachers. These projects will be de-34 veloped by the commissioner and the state board, in 35 consultation with local administrative units and rep-36 resentatives from other appropriate support constitu-37 encies, beginning on the effective date of this Act. 38 The number of projects to be developed and the selec-39 tion of units to be involved in the projects will be 40 determined by the state board. The pilot projects 41 shall terminate as of July 1, 1987.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

16 In 1981, the Legislature gave the State Board of Education sole authority to establish the policies, rules and regulations for teacher certification in 17 18 19 Maine. This bill is the result of a 3-year effort by the state board to respond to that mandate. It pro-20 21 poses a clear-cut policy which upgrades and 22 strengthens the requirements for teaching in Maine.

The state board has met frequently with professions from all segments of education - teachers, principals, superintendents, university faculty, college faculty and students. Public hearings were held throughout the State on a report prepared for the state board by a special consultant on teacher certification.

30 In this bill, the State Board of Education af-31 firms the teaching profession as of the highest value 32 in our society, highlights the importance of the 33 classroom as the setting for professional development 34 and emphasizes the importance of continuous profes-35 sional development.

The state board has developed the following concepts which stress a balance between statewide policy and direction for certifying teachers and local control and flexibility in carrying out those policies and in supporting teachers. 1 1. All teachers will have a strong liberal arts 2 and science background with a major field of study in 3 the subject area to be taught.

2. A preliminary certificate is the initial certificate issued to beginning teachers for a 2-year
period. The teacher, working with a locally-designed
support system, will attain a high level of effectiveness, resulting in a professional certificate.
The preliminary certificate is nonrenewable.

10 3. A professional certificate will be issued to 11 the beginning teacher demonstrating high level 12 competencies to a local support team during the ini-13 tial 2-year teaching period. The professional certif-14 icate will be issued for 5 years and is renewable.

15 certificate 4. А master teacher will be 16 attainable for a teacher who holds professional cer-17 tification and has demonstrated exemplary profession-18 al skills in classroom teaching or in such other ar-19 supervising student teachers, curriculum and eas as 20 staff development or in-service training, as deter-21 mined by the local school unit.

22 5. Pilot projects designed to identify procedures for training and certifying master teachers 23 24 will be developed in consultation with local adminis-25 trative units and will be in effect from 1984 to 26 1987. A report on the results of the projects, with 27 recommendations for funding, will be ready for the 28 112th Legislature. Although this bill does not re-29 quire all districts to have master teachers, such a 30 career opportunity for teachers is strongly encour-31 aged.

32 Support systems are to be planned and devel-6. 33 oped by local school units. The support system plan provides for local support teams to 'improve the 34 35 teaching effectiveness of all teachers with special 36 emphasis on the beginning teacher. These support 37 teams will be composed of a majority of teachers and 38 other professional personnel to assist and develop 39 teaching techniques and competencies. Local units are 40 encouraged to make every effort to develop partner-41 ships with institutions of higher education, the De-42 partment of Educational and Cultural Services and 43 other community resources.

1 7. A teacher action plan is a joint agreement 2 between a beginning teacher and a local support team 3 designed to develop training experiences for increas-4 ing teaching effectiveness. A master teacher, if 5 available, shall coordinate a teacher action plan.

6 8. All teaching certificates will have endorse-7 ments specifying grades and subjects a person is 8 qualified to teach. Teachers may no longer teach 9 grades or subjects for which they are not prepared.

10 9. Visiting teacher permits may be issued to 11 people who do not intend to enter the teaching pro-12 fession full time in order to offer their special ex-13 pertise to schools on a limited basis.

14 10. Teacher certification standards will be re-15 viewed by the State Board of Education every 6 years 16 and their findings will be reported to the Legisla-17 ture.

18 11. The 3 levels of proposed certification do 19 not in themselves constitute a career ladder but do 20 provide a framework in which local districts can con-21 struct viable career advancement opportunities for 22 teachers.

This bill, with the exception of the pilot projects for master teachers, becomes effective for all teacher certificates issued after June 30, 1988.
