1 censed milk dealer and sufficient information to identify the milk plant where packaged as required by 2 3 section 2903 milk plant where packaged. Following the 4 consolidation or closing of one or more milk plants, a 60-day period shall be allowed for the printing of 5 labels to comply with this section. During that 6 7 60-day period, the identification number of the processing plant may be used instead of the name and ad-8 9 dress required by this section.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

11 This bill amends the milk labeling law by requir-12 ing that containers of milk and cream sold in the 13 State bear the name and address of the milk plant 14 where the milk is packaged. Under present law only a plant identification number is required. While it is 15 16 possible for Maine consumers to translate a plant 17 identification number into plant name and address, thereby learning where the milk and cream they con-18 19 sume are packaged, in practice, it is a burdensome 20 process which discourages most consumers. This bill 21 has no significant effect on state revenue or expend-22 itures.

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
