16	mation. "Intelligence and investigative information"

18	cies in an effort to anticipate, prevent or monitor
19	possible criminal activity, including operation plans
20	of the collecting agency or another agency, or
21	information compiled in the course of investigation
22	of known or suspected crimes. It does not include
23	information that is criminal history record informa-
