AN ACT to Limit the Sale of Liquors  
with a High Percent of Alcohol.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

28 MRSA §1062 is enacted to read:

§1062. Sale of liquors with high alcohol content

No person, firm corporation or any other entity which is licensed pursuant to and falls within the provisions of chapter 19 may serve, sell or offer for sale or exchange any liquor which contains 61 proof of alcohol or more by volume. This prohibition does not apply to retail stores established pursuant to chapter 17.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to establish a prohibition on the sale of liquor containing 61 proof or more alcohol by volume for on-premise consumption.
