17 18 19	AN ACT Concerning Car Auctions and the Validity of Motor Vehicle Titles.
20 21	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
. 22	29 MRSA §368 is enacted to read:
23	§368. Sale or transfer by vehicle auctioneer
· 24 25	1. Prohibition. No vehicle auctioneer may sell or transfer an interest in a motor vehicle if:
26 27 28	A. The odometer reading at the time of the sale or transfer is different from the number of miles the vehicles has actually been driven; or
29 30 31	B. Title to the motor vehicle is subject to any undisclosed lien or encumbrance at the time of the sale or transfer.

1 2. Remedy. If a vehicle auctioneer violates the 2 provisions of subsection 1, a vendee, transferee or 3 any person in lawful possession of the vehicle as a 4 subsequent purchaser has the right to rescind the sale or transfer by delivery of written notice of the 5 6 rescission and delivery of the motor vehicle to the 7 auctioneer or his agent or representative within one 8 year of the date of sale or transfer.

9 The vehicle auctioneer is liable for damages to the 10 person rescinding the sale or transfer in the amount 11 of the full purchase price paid to the auctioneer.

12 <u>3. Violation. A violation of this section by an</u> 13 <u>auctioneer is a Class E crime.</u>

STATEMENT OF FACT

15 The purpose of this bill is to prohibit vehicle auctioneers from selling or transferring interests in 16 17 motor vehicles in which the odometer readings are 18 different from the number of miles the vehicles have 19 actually been driven or the titles to which are sub-20 ject to undisclosed liens or encumbrances. This bill 21 also provides a civil remedy for a violation by an 22 auctioneer and makes the violation a Class E crime.
