cavity search of an arrestee when the arrestee is concealing a weapon or where an officer has a reasonable belief that the arrestee may be concealing contraband or evidence of a crime.

Each officer within the Department of Public Safety and within any sheriff's department or police department shall follow these rules relating to body searches and body cavity searches. Any officer who fails to comply with the rules shall be subject to a civil suit for damages.

A copy of these rules shall be furnished to each officer within the department and to each sheriff's department and police department statewide and shall be filed and be available for public inspection at the headquarters of each department.

An arrestee shall not be subject to a body search or body cavity search when he has been arrested for a traffic violation or a Class E or D crime, or a violation of a city, county or town ordinance which is punishable by no more than 30 days in jail, unless there is reasonable cause to believe on the part of the law enforcement officer authorizing the search that the individual is concealing a weapon, contraband or evidence of a crime or unless the arrestee is about to come into contact with the inmate population of a detention facility.

Body cavity searches other than the mouth shall be conducted by or under the supervision of medically trained personnel.

Body searches or body cavity searches shall be conducted by an officer or officers of the same sex as the arrestee under conditions so that the search cannot be observed by persons other than the officer or officers conducting the search.

Each body search or body cavity search shall be recorded in a log kept by the department, sheriff's department or police department indicating the person who ordered the search, the name of the arrestee and the location of the search.

37 38 39 The purpose of this bill is to ensure statewide uniformity in the procedures for body searches and body cavity searches of arrestees by law enforcement officers. Under this bill, the Commissioner of Public Saftey shall prepare and promulgate rules relating to body searches and body cavity searches which

shall be complied with by all officers. If any officer does not comply with the rules, he will be subject to a civil suit for damages.
