The school year, for the purpose of this subsection, is defined as starting on July 1st and ending on the following June 30th.

A. War veterans who have not completed high school before their 18th birthday may enroll in the public schools in the school administrative units where they reside until they graduate or until the end of the school year in which they reach the age of 25.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The new draft clarifies the definition of school year for the purposes of determining all students' eligibility to enroll in school. It clarifies that the eligibility to enroll entitles the student to complete the school year for which the student was entitled to enroll. It does not change the present statute entitling a student to enroll in school up until they are age 20, 25 if they are veterans. The original bill dealt only with the ambiguity in the present law as it applied to special education students. The new draft clarifies the definition for both special education and all other students.
