AN ACT to Provide for Public Notifications of the Intent to Apply Pesticides and for Monitoring Certain Pesticide Application Projects.					
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:					
22 MRSA §1471-R is enacted to read:					
§1471-R. Notification and monitoring					
1. Purpose. The purpose of this section is to					
establish reasonable measures to safeguard the public					
by requiring a system of public notification prior to					
the commencement of certain pesticide spray projects					
and to provide for a meaningful degree of monitoring of these projects by the Board of Pesticides Control.

2. Scope. The requirements of this section shall					
apply to the following categories of pesticide use:					

A. Spray applications on or along public or private roads and rights-of-way, including, without limitation, utility rights-of-way and railroad rights-of-way;

- B. Forestry spray applications by aircraft;
- C. All other spray applications by aircraft;
- D. Spray applications by ground mist blowers; and
 - E. All other applications of pesticides by any means other than nonpowered, hand-held apparatus.
- 3. Notification. Prior to the commencement of any of the activities described in subsection 2, notice shall be given. Definitions for the sytems to be used are as follows.
 - A. Notice shall be placed in a newspaper of general circulation in the area affected. The notice shall appear at least 7 days and no more than 30 days prior to the commencement of the activity for the season. The notice shall describe the proposed spray activity, the area to be sprayed, the pesticides to be used, the date or dates on which the spraying is proposed to take place and the name, address and telephone number of the person responsible for the activity, well as the following message: "Information on any public precautions which appear on the pesticide(s) label is available upon request from the person responsible for the activity; the local extension service agricultural agent, (include name and phone number); the Maine Poison Control Center, 1-800-442-6305; and the Board of Pesticides Control, 289-2731."
 - B. Abutter notification. Abutters shall be notified of spraying activities as follows.
 - (1) At least 7 days and no more than 30 days prior to the commencement of the spray activities, all abutters of the properties to be sprayed shall be notified by mail, telephone or personal visit. The notifica-

Considerations of a need for ad-15 16 ditional public notification and for the necessity of 17 performing a spray monitoring program shall be based 18 in part on the scope of the spray operation, the location of the spray operation, the performance records of applicators and land owners involved and 19 20 the toxicity of the pesticides being used. These 21 22 ditional requirements may include, but are not lim-23 ited to: 24 A. Radio and television announcement programs; 25 B. Posting of public points of ingress and 26 egress; 27 C. Posting of roadsides; D. The Board of Pesticides Control may require a 28 29 written report to be filed within 15 days of the 30 completion of specified spray activities, includ-31 ing emergency spray applications. The report 32 shall describe the spray activity and shall cer-33 tify the area and acreage actually sprayed, the 34 pesticide or pesticides used and the date 35 dates on which spraying activities actually took 36 place. The report will be completed on forms pre-37 scribed by the board. The board shall notify the 38 responsible person in writing that a report

required; and

- E. If the Board of Pesticides Control requires a report, the board may also require a fee which shall accompany the report filed under paragraph D. The amounts so collected shall be placed in a nonlapsing special account to be expended by the board for the purposes of administering a program of monitoring and enforcement of spraying activities. The board may assess a fee of up to 10¢ per acre based upon the acreage actually sprayed, as certified under paragraph D. The board shall notify the person responsible in writing that a fee is required and the amount of the fee.
- 6. Responsibility. The following parties shall be responsible for complying with the requirements of this section:
 - A. In the case of the forest spray program administered under Title 12, chapter 803, subchapter IV-A: The Maine Bureau of Forestry;
 - B. In the case of pesticide spray activities along a public road or right-of-way: The public entity which owns the road or right-of-way;
 - C. In the case of a pesticide spray operation along a private road or right-of-way, including without limitation, a utility or railroad right-of-way, the owner of the road or right-of-way; and
 - D. In all other cases of spray operation included in this subsection: The landowner, or with his written designation, the land manager, or, if the land is leased, the lessee.

31 STATEMENT OF FACT

 The purpose of this bill is to promote public safety by establishing a system of public notification provisions prior to the application of pesticide and herbicide spray and by providing for monitoring procedures to be used by the Pesticides Control Board in the review of spray application projects. The bill stipulates the specific notification requirements for the following categories of pesticide spray applications:
