15 16	3. Fisheries and game wardens hired before Sep- tember 1, 1984. Each law enforcement officer in the
17	Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife employed
18	before September 1, 1984, and each law enforcement
19 20	officer in the Department of Marine Resources shall contribute at a rate of 7.5% of earnable compensation
21	until he has completed 20 years of creditable ser-
22	vice, as required under section 1121, subsection 1,
23 24	paragraph D. After completing such that service, a law enforcement officer in the Department of Inland
25	Fisheries and Wildlife or in the Department of Marine
26	Resources shall contribute at a rate of 6.5% of earn-
27 28	able compensation for the remainder of his employment as such a law enforcement officer.
29	A commissioner or a deputy commissioner of the De-
30	partment of Marine Resources may elect to contribute
31	as a member under subsection 1 rather than this sub-
32 33	section if he files a written copy of the election of that choice with the board of trustees.

36	D. Any law enforcement officer in the Department

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of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife who is employed 1 as such before September 1, 1984, and any law en-2 3 forcement officer in the Department of Marine Resources may retire upon completion of 20 years of 4 5 creditable service as a law enforcement officer in the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildб life or a law enforcement officer in the Depart-7 ment of Marine Resources. Military service cred-8 9 its, as allowed under section 1094, shall not be considered as part of the creditable service as a 10 11 law enforcement officer under this section, but 12 any military service creditable under section 1091 shall be considered to be part of the cred-13 itable service necessary for the 20 years as a 14 law enforcement officer, provided that he was a 15 law enforcement officer in either of these de-16 17 partments at the time of entrance into such military service and upon separation from military 18 19 service again became a law enforcement officer in either of these departments. The total amount of 20 the service retirement allowance of a law en-21 forcement officer retired in accordance with this 22 23 paragraph, shall be equal to 1/2 of his average 24 final compensation and an additional 2% of his average final compensation for each year of mem-25 bership service not included in determining eli-26 27 gibility for retirement under this paragraph. 28

A law enforcement officer in the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife who has become a member of that department on or after September 1, 1984, may retire after completion of 25 years of creditable service as a law enforcement officer in the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and attainment of age 55. The service retirement shall be determined in accordance with subsection 2, paragraph A.

Any such law enforcement officer who has com pleted 25 or more years of creditable service may
retire at any time prior to the attainment of age
55 and receive a service retirement allowance.

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1 The retirement allowance shall be determined in accordance with subsection 2, paragraph A, but shall be at a reduced amount determined by apply-2 ing to the retirement allowance the percentage that a life annuity due at age 55 bears to the life annuity due at the age of retirement, subject to this subsection. For this purpose, the tables of annuities as approved by the board of trustees at the dates of retirement shall be 10 used.

11 Upon the death of a law enforcement officer of 12 the Department of Marine Resources or a law en-13 forcement officer of the Department of Inland 14 Fisheries and Wildlife who is the recipient of a 15 allowance under this retirement section paragraph, without optional modification, or is 16 17 retired under the disability provisions, the surviving spouse, shall become entitled to a retire-18 19 ment allowance which shall be equal to 1/2 of the amount being paid at the time of his death and 20 which payment shall continue for the remainder of 21 his or her lifetime or until he or she becomes 22 23 the dependent of another person.

24 A commissioner or a deputy commissioner of the 25 Department of Marine Resources may retire under this paragraph if he has contributed as a law en-26 27 forcement officer under section 1095, subsection 28 3.1

29 Further amend the bill by renumbering the Parts 30 to read consecutively.

2 3 4 5	This amendment provides that any law enforcement officer in the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife employed after September 1, 1984, may retire at age 55 or after 25 years of creditable service.
