AN ACT to Allow Persons Holding
Occupational Licenses in the State who Enter
the Armed Forces to Obtain Inactive Licenses
for Reduced Fees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

32 MRSA c. 105 is enacted to read:

CHAPTER 105

INACTIVE PROFESSIONAL AND OCCUPATIONAL LICENSES

§9901. Licensees entering Armed Forces; inactive li-
censes

Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, any
person holding a valid professional or occupational
license or certificate issued pursuant to this Title

1 or issued by any bureau, board or commission within
2 the Department of Business, Occupational and Profes-
3 sional Regulation who enters the United States Armed
4 Forces shall, upon request, for the duration of that
5 person's service in the Armed Forces, be issued an
6 inactive license or certificate. The fee for the is-
7 suance of an inactive license or certificate, issued
8 pursuant to this section, shall be 10% of the fee for
9 an active license or certificate for the same type of
10 professional or occupational license.

11 STATEMENT OF FACT

12 The purpose of this bill is to provide that per-
13 sons who hold professional or occupational licenses
14 and who enter the Armed Forces shall be eligible for
15 inactive licenses for the duration of their service
16 in the military. The fee for the inactive licenses
17 would be 10% of the fee for an active license.

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
