SENATE AMENDMENT " C " to H.P. 1776, L.D. 2354,

"RESOLVE, to Establish a Select Committee Concerning

9

Forest Practices in the State."

10

Amend the resolve by striking out all of the  
11 emergency preamble.

12

Further amend the resolve after the emergency  
13 preamble by striking out the first and 2nd paragraphs  
14 (page 2, lines 7 to 25 in L.D.) and inserting in  
15 their place the following:

16

'Select committee established. RESOLVED: That a  
17 select committee is established to study the forest  
18 practice actions occurring in the State. The commit-  
19 tee shall consist of the following members: Three  
20 members of the Joint Standing Committee on Energy and  
21 Natural Resources; 3 members of the Joint Standing  
22 Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife; one mem-  
23 ber representing woodcutters; one member representing  
24 the Paper Industry Information Office; one member  
25 representing the University of Maine Department of  
26 Forestry; one member representing the Maine Chapter  
27 of the Society of American Foresters; one member of  
28 the Small Woodlot Owners Association of Maine; and  
29 one member of the public. The Speaker of the House  
30 of Representatives and the President of the Senate  
31 shall appoint the legislative committee members. The  
32 Governor shall appoint the nonlegislative committee  
33 members in the following manner: The members repre-  
34 senting the Paper Industry Information Office, the  
35 Maine Chapter of the Society of American Foresters  
36 and the Small Woodlot Owners Association of Maine  
37 shall be chosen from lists of 3 individuals submitted  
38 by the respective organizations; and the members  
39 representing woodcutters and the public shall be cho-  
40 sen by the Governor in such manner as the Governor

1       deems proper.

2               Study. RESOLVED: That the committee shall deter-  
3       mine whether or not there is a need for legislation  
4       dealing with forest practices. The committee shall  
5       also study the affects of forest practices on the  
6       fisheries and wildlife of the State and the impact of  
7       future trends in forest products markets on the  
8       state's forest resources. The committee may request  
9       staff support from the Legislative Council.'

10               Further amend the resolve in the last paragraph  
11       before the emergency clause in the 2nd line (page 2,  
12       line 33 in L.D.) by inserting after the figure and  
13       word "\$3,000 to" the following 'the Legislative Ac-  
14       count to'

15               Further amend the resolve in the last paragraph  
16       before the emergency clause in the 5th, 6th and 7th  
17       lines (page 2, lines 36 to 38 in L.D.) by striking  
18       out the punctuation and words ", except that the rep-  
19       resentative of the Bureau of Forestry shall not re-  
20       ceive a per diem payment"

21               Further amend the resolve by striking out all of  
22       the emergency clause.


