25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34	The presidents, prefessors and tutors of colleges, the preceptors and teachers of academies and all other instructors Instructors of youth in public or private institutions shall use their best endeavors to impress on the minds of the children and youth committed to their care and instruction the principles of morality and justice and a sacred regard for truth; love of country, humanity and a universal benevolence; sebricty, the great principles of humanity as illustrated by kindness to birds and animals and

regard for all factors which contribute to the wellbeing of man; industry and frugality; chastity, moderation and temperance; and all other virtues which ornament human society; and to lead those under their care, as their ages and capacities admit, into a particular understanding of the tendency of such virtues to preserve and perfect a republican constitution, secure the blessings of liberty and to promote their future happiness and the tendency of the opposite vices, to slavery, degradation and ruin. All teachers the public schools of the State shall devote not less than 1/2 hour of each week of the school term to teaching to the children under their charge, in correlation with other studies of the school curriculum, the great principles of humanity as illustrated by kindness to birds and animals and regard for all facters which contribute to the well-being of man-

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30 31 §1224-A. Release time for religious observance

Public school students who participate in a course of moral instruction or a religious observance at their place of worship or other suitable place may be granted release time for the period actually spent on that instruction or observance, up to a maximum of one hour per week. The granting of release time shall be at the option of the local school unit and shall not result in any additional cost to the local school unit. Release time shall be granted in accordance with policies established by the local school unit.

STATEMENT OF FACT

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2 This new draft continues much of the current lan-3 guage on the teaching of virtue and morality which 4 was deleted in the original bill; repeals provisions 5 dealing with scripture reading which is unconstitu-6 tional; and repeals several sections dealing with providing moral instruction and replaces them with 7 8 section providing for release time for moral in-9 struction or religious observances. The provisions 10 of the original bill establishing a legislative poli-11 cy on school curriculum and providing for instruction in several skill areas have been deleted. 12

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
