Notwithstanding any other requirements of this chapter, milk and milk products, defined in accordance with standards then in effect which have been adopted by the United States Government and labeled in conformity with labeling requirements then in effect which have been adopted by the United States Government, shall be deemed to conform with the definitions and labeling requirements set forth in this chapter, except for the definition of "milk" in section 2901, subsection 17, and except that containers of milk and cream shall also bear the name and address of the Maine licensed milk dealer and sufficient information to identify the milk plant where packaged as required by section 2903.

Sec. 3. 7 MRSA §2903, 9th ¶, as amended by PL 1971, c. 164, §15, is further amended to read:

It shall be unlawful to sell or serve any milk, skim milk, nonfat or fat-free milk, flavored milk or flavored dairy drink, or low fat milk, fortified milk and milk products, except milk and milk products specially processed to retain quality without refrigeration, in a hotel, soda fountain, restaurant, grocery store, hospital or similar establishment which has not been maintained while in its possession, at a temperature of 45° 40° Fahrenheit, or less, in dry storage. Wet storage is specifically prohibited.

Sec. 4. 7 MRSA §3103, sub-§5, ¶N, as amended by PL 1971, c. 164, §19, is further amended to read:

Bottling and packaging. Bottling and packaging of pasteurized milk, pasteurized skim milk, pasteurized nonfat or fat-free milk, pasteurized flavored milk or flavored dairy drink, ized low-fat milk, pasteurized fortified milk and pasteurized milk products shall be done at the place of pasteurization. Bottling and packaging must take place in approved mechanical equipment in such manner as to prevent any part of the person or clothing from coming in contact with surface with which milk or milk products come in contact. Pasteurized milk may be transferred for bottling and packaging only when necessary because of a breakdown of pasteurization equipment. The person proposing to receive the pasteurized milk shall notify the commissioner prior to making the proposed transfer. The commissioner shall determine that the breakdown necessitates the transfer and, if he determines that it does, he shall supervise the transfer, taking samples as necessary to assure the safety of public health. Overflow milk shall not be sold for human consumption.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

The new draft increases the requirement of butterfat content of milk from 3.25% to 3.5%. It excepts milk and milk products especially processed from the prohibition on serving unless the product has been maintained at 40° Fahrenheit. It permits the transfer of pasteurized milk for bottling or packaging only upon breakdown of pasteurization equipment. It excepts the definition of milk from the conformance with the United States government standards. The definition of milk for Maine is included in section 1 of this new draft.
