20 21 22 23 24	AN ACT to Raise the Annual Public Utilities Commission Regulatory Fund Assessments to \$1,635,000 and to Allocate those Funds for Fiscal Year 1985.
25 26	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
27 28 29	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Public Utilities Commission requires additional funds to allow it to discharge its public responsibilities during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1985; and

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Whereas, the assessment for the first of those fiscal years, fiscal year 1985, must take place before May 1, 1984; and

Whereas, the current assessment allowance will not provide the Public Utilities Commission with sufficient funds; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

- Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- - Utilities subject to assessments. Every electric, gas, telegraph, telephone and water utility subject to regulation by the commission and every water carrier subject to the jurisdiction of the commission pursuant to Private and Special Act of the Legislature shall be subject to an assessment of not more than .25% on its intrastate gross operating revenues to produce no more than \$1,160,000 \$1,335,000in revenues annually beginning in the 1983-84 1984-85 fiscal year. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the amount of annual revenue to be raised by section shall be increased by an additional \$300,000 to supplant an equal amount of General revenues used previously to fund commission activities which shall instead be appropriated for the use of the Public Advocate. The commission shall determine the assessments annually prior to May 1st and shall assess each utiltiy for its pro rata Each utility shall pay the assessment charged to the utility on or before July 1st of each year.

1 The assessments charged to utilities under this section shall be deemed just and reasonable 2 3 operating costs for rate-making purposes. 4 В. 13	STATEMENT OF FACT
14 15 16	This new draft raises the annual Public Utilitie Comission's Regulatory Fund assessment by \$175,00 and allocates that amount.

Specifically, the personal services, All Other and Capital Expenditures encompassed within the table presented in this bill consist of the following proposed uses for these additional funds:

- 1. To allocate funds for the establishment of 3 Clerk Typist II positions in the Public Utilities Commission Regulatory Fund, beginning in fiscal year 1984-85. Cost of each position is \$13,268.50. The cost of all 3 positions is \$39,805.50;
- 2. To allocate funds for the establishment of a Clerk Steno III position in the Public Utilities Commission Regulatory Fund, beginning in fiscal year 1984-85, position to be located in the secretary's office. The cost of the position is \$14,887.50;
- 3. To allocate funds for the establishment of a Computer Research Specialist position in the Public Utilities Commission Regulatory Fund, beginning in fiscal year, 1984-85, position to be located in the Finance Division. The cost of the position is \$23,081;

4. To allocate funds for the establishment of a Utility Technical Analyst position in the Public Utilities Commission Regulatory Fund, beginning in fiscal year 1984-85, position to be located in the Technical Analysis Division. The cost of the position is \$23,081;

- 5. To allocate funds for a variety of All Other budget category increases, including \$22,000 in general operating expenses, increases in postage, printing and legal advertising, \$11,000 in professional services and \$13,025 as the appropriate increase STA-CAP, for a total All Other category increase of \$46,025; and
- 6. To allocate funds for an increase in the commission's capital expenditures budget category in order to facilitate the acquisition of a word-processing system, with a total cost of approximately \$40,000, replacing a current annual rental cost for an incomplete system in excess of \$42,000. The amount proposed to be additionally allocated for this purpose, together with \$13,000 in General Fund reallocations, is \$28,120.

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
