	27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35	The number and complexity of the matters which fall within the statutory responsibility of the Sec- retary of State have increased in recent years, par- ticularly in the motor vehicle division. Because of the many pressing demands upon the offices of the At- torney General and the 8 district attorneys of the State, it would be helpful to the overall enforcement effort if an attorney who is employed on the staff of the Secretary of State and who is familiar with the
