- 5 shall be members of the Joint Standing Committee on 1 Education and 3 of whom shall be members of the Joint 2 3 Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial 4 Affairs. The President of the Senate shall appoint 3 of the legislator members; and the Speaker of the House shall appoint 5 of the legislator members. Legislative members shall represent a bipartisan 5 6 7 point of view. The remaining 4 members shall be ap-9 pointed by the Governor and shall be persons familiar 10 with education and education finance, 2 of whom shall be the Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Ser-11 vices, or his designee, and the Commissioner of Fi-12 nance and Administration, or his designee. Members 13 shall serve until accomplishment of the tasks speci-14 fied in this chapter. Legislative members shall not 15 16 be disqualified for discontinuance of legislative 17 service. Vacancies may be filled with qualified ap-18 pointees by the appointing authority.
- 2. Commission duties. The commission shall study issues related to the implementation of education reform in Maine. The commission shall address the following concerns and take the following action:
- 23 Study the impact on local communities of the education finance act and of implementing in-24 creased curriculum and graduation requirements 25 26 and recommend ways to meet increased local needs. 27 The commission shall estimate projected local costs, including catastrophic costs, and propose 28 29 alternative methods for meeting those costs, in-30 cluding recommendations for additional state 31 funding of education costs;
 - B. Study and make recommendations on ways to permanently enhance teacher compensation, including examination of a statewide salary schedule, a minimum base salary, stipends and other options which may be submitted to the commission for consideration;
 - C. Study and make recommendations on the need

- for and methods of ensuring the maintenance of local educational efforts and that state funded recognition grants shall not be considered in the collective bargaining process;
- Study the definition of teacher, including 5 part-time personnel, for the purpose of determin-7 ing ways of enhancing compensation for education-8 al personnel. In conducting this part of its study, the commission shall bear in mind that the 9 purpose is to enhance the status of and to re-10 11 ward classroom teachers. The commission 12 make recommendations on the short-term and longterm implementation of a teacher compensation 13 14 plan; and shall include in its report an assess-15 ment of the need for a panel to settle disputes 16 regarding teacher compensation;
- E. Study the advantages and disadvantages of and make recommendations on the inclusion of increased teacher compensation within the definition of earnable compensation for retirement purposes;
- F. Study the operation of collective bargaining at the local level and make recommendations for changes which would improve the quality of education; and
- 26 G. Examine and make recommendations on other is-27 sues which the commission determines affect the 28 quality of education in Maine.
- 29 3. Commission report. The commission shall port to the Joint Standing Committee on Education. 30 31 The report shall include estimated state and local 32 costs of recommendations and implementing legisla-33 tion, if necessary. The first report shall be due on 34 April 1, 1985. In the succeeding years, the commis-35 sion shall report annually on January 1st, until such 36 time as the committee determines it has completed its

37 task.

| 1 2 3 | A. On April 1, 1985, the commission shall recommend an interim mechanism for expending allocated moneys to enhance teacher remuneration. |

1 STATEMENT OF FACT

2 The purpose of this amendment is to correct an inconsistency on dates within the bill and to create 3 4 a special commission to study and monitor the impact 5 of the implementation of educational reform. The en-6 actment of "An Act to Implement the Recommendations 7 of the Commission on the Status of Education in 8 Maine" mandated a number of programs for improving 9 the quality of education. Some of these programs 10 will result in additional costs to the State and to 11 local communities. The special commission created by this amendment will monitor the implementation of the 12 13 Act and make recommendations regarding adjustments to these programs to ensure that they are working to im-14 15 prove the quality of education and that their costs 16 are being borne equitably. It also indicates the 17 Legislature's intent to appropriate moneys for en-18 hancing teacher remuneration in future years and 19 changes the commission recommended interim and perma-20 nent mechanisms for disbursing these funds.
