- Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
- 7 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 8 follows:

  10 1983, c. 859, Pt. B., §3, is further amended to read:
- 1. Report to Governor and Legislature. The commissioner shall prepare and deliver to the Governor
  and Legislature an annual report on the status of
  public education in the State, including any suggestions and recommendations to improve public education.
- The commissioner shall may be invited by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate annually, in January, to appear before a joint session of the Legislature to address the Legislature on the status of public education in the State and such related matters as the commissioner desires to bring to the Legislature's attention.
- Sec. 3. PL 1983, c. 859, Pt. J, §§5 and 6 shall take effect immediately.
- 28 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency set out in the preamble, sections 2 and 3 of this Act shall take effect when approved.
