18 19 20	AN ACT Prohibiting State Agencies from Purchasing Real Property.
21 22 23	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
24 25 26	Whereas, when state agencies purchase real prop- erty which was previously privately owned the local tax base is reduced; and
27 28 29	Whereas, a purchase of real property of the State thereby increases the tax burden of local taxpayers; and
30 31 32 33 34 35	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preser- vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

3 Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §1742, sub-§19, as amended by PL 4 1967, c. 307, is further amended to read:

5 19. Facilities required by State. To lease or approve the leasing of grounds, buildings, facilities 6 7 and office space required by departments and agencies 8 of the State Government. No lease shall be for a pe-9 riod of more than 20 years to purchase grounds, 10 buildings, facilities and office space necessary for 11 the conduct of state business by agencies, boards, 12 commissions and departments of State Government;

Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §1742, as amended by PL 1983, c.
824, Pt. Y, is further amended by adding at the end a
new paragraph to read:

16 Except as provided in subsection 19, no agency, 17 board, commission or department of State Government 18 may have authority to purchase grounds, buildings, 19 facilities and office space for its own use or for 20 investment purposes.

21 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited 22 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when ap-23 proved.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

25 The purpose of this bill is to prohibit state agencies from purchasing real property. When the State acquires ownership of previously privately 26 27 28 owned property, the local tax base is reduced thereby increasing the tax burden of local taxpayers. 29 This 30 is a policy which should be avoided whenever possi-31 ble. In circumstances where purchase of real proper-32 ty is necessary, the Bureau of Public Improvements 33 would oversee the purchase by the State.

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
