24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35 36	6. <u>Municipal septage sites.</u> Each municipality shall provide for the disposal of all refuse, efflu- ent, sludge and any other materials from all septic tanks and cesspools located within the municipality. In addition, any person may provide a site for dis- posal of septage. Before making application to the Department of Environmental Protection for approval of any site, that person shall first have written ap- proval for the site location from the municipality in which it is located. The municipality or the munici- pal officers authorized to act for the municipality; after hearing, shall approve, after hearing, any such private site if it finds that the site does not con-	

stitute a hazard to the health or safety of the residents of the municipality.

STATEMENT OF FACT

4 The purpose of this bill is to give the municipal 5 officers the authorization to approve private septage 6 disposal sites in all instances.

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
