19 Special Commission to Study the
20 Implementation of Educational Reform.

22 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legis-
23 lature do not become effective until 90 days after
24 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

25 Whereas, the Special Commission to Study the Im-
26 plementation of Educational Reform is required by
27 Public Law 1983, chapter 859, to study several new
28 and dramatic changes to the state educational system;
29 and

30 Whereas, without immediate enactment of this
31 bill, the commission cannot fulfill its mandated
32 functions; and

33 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature,
34 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of
35 the Constitution of Maine and require the following

1 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-
2 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
3 therefore,

4 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
5 follows:

6 PL 1983, c. 859, Part J, §6, is repealed and the
7 following enacted in its place:

8 Sec. 6. Appropriation. There is appropriated
9 from the General Fund \$13,000 for the fiscal year
10 ending June 30, 1985, to carry out the purposes of
11 this Part.
