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STATEMENT OF FACT

2 This bill clarifies the law so as to make it 3 beyond any doubt that family members can bury clear 4 their own dead or can authorize some other person who 5 may or may not be a funeral director to act for them 6 and to broaden the statute to make it clear that the 7 overseers of the poor or the welfare director in а 8 particular community could arrange for a simple buri-9 al or cremation service without having to involve a 10 funeral director.

11 Although the municipal officers in the various 12 cities and towns with responsibility of seeing to the 13 burial of deceased paupers, there is nothing in the statute which would clearly authorize the municipal 14 15 officers or the welfare director in a particular com-16 munity to arrange for the cremation or burial service themselves or to authorize someone who was not a fu-17 neral director to do it for them. 18

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
