- 6 25 MRSA §1503 is amended to read:
- 7 §1503. Uniform and equipment

8 Members of the State Police shall be provided at 9 expense of the State with a distinctive uniform 10 and badge, and with suitable equipment, all of which shall remain the property of the State. When on duty 11 12 to enforce the laws of the road, and at such other 13 times as the chief may require, state policemen shall 14 be in uniform. They shall held no other effice during 15 their term of service. It shall be unlawful for any 16 person to wear the prescribed uniform or badge of the 17 State Police or any distinctive part thereof, except 18 on order of the chief of said the State Police.

- 19 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited 20 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when ap-21 proved.
- 22 STATEMENT OF FACT

Present state law prohibits members of the State Police from holding nonpartisan local service. This bill is designed to permit members of the State Police to hold offices such as school board officials, selectman and other nonpartisan offices.

The Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 679-A, subsection 3, already prohibits election to partisan positions.
