Director of the Bureau of Parks and Recreation; property conveyed by quitclaim deed. Resolved: That the director of the Bureau of Parks and Recreation may convey by quitclaim deed and for no monetary consideration the following properties:

- 1. To the inhabitants of the Town of Unity, a parcel containing 5.5 acres, more or less, known as the Sandy Stream Boat Access Site, as acquired from James E. Shores, et al, by deed, dated October 1, 1969, and recorded at the Waldo County Registry of Deeds in Book 677, Page 889;
- 2. To the inhabitants of the Town of Milbridge, a parcel containing 5.0 acres, more or less, known as the Narraguagus River Boat Facility, as acquired from the inhabitants of the Town of Milbridge, by deed, dated April 10, 1970, and recorded at the Washington County Registry of Deeds in Book 681, Page 568; and
- 3. To the inhabitants of the Town of Monmouth, a parcel containing 60 acres, more or less, known as the Cobbosseecontee Lake Boat Facility, a portion of the property as acquired from William G. Lindquist, et al, by deed, dated September 30, 1970, and recorded at the Kennebec County Registry of Deeds in Book 1532, Page 279.
- Each shall be on such terms and conditions and for such consideration, as the director may direct.

27 STATEMENT OF FACT

The Pleasant Pond Access Site, Gardiner, which is proposed to be conveyed was acquired for public boat access purposes. During the period since acquisition an agreement has been executed with the Town of Litchfield to provide for public boat access to Pleasant Pond from an alternate location under town control. The undeveloped property, acquired by the Bureau of Parks and Recreation for a boat launching site, will be sold following development of a new site by the Town of Litchfield.

The 3 properties proposed to be conveyed to the towns of Unity, Milbridge and Monmouth were acquired for public boat access purposes. During the period since acquisition, the use and operation of each facility has shown the facilities will be more equitably operated locally, rather than by the State, indicating the propriety of municipal ownership and operation. Provisions for continuing and nondiscriminating operation of boat access and related outdoor recreation uses would be contained in any deeds of conveyance.
