## STATEMENT OF FACT

Enforcement of the law dealing with premarital 2 3 medical examinations has been suspended by administrative action for over 10 years. During the last 4 years of enforcement, \$400,000 was spent testing 4 5 6 100,000 people to detect one new case of primary The data from the state's sexually trans-7 syphilis. 8 mitted disease program continues to indicate that the 9 syphilis cases occurring in Maine are in groups other than the group of persons contemplating marriage. 10 11 More than 20 states have repealed their premarital syphilis laws. The Bureau of Health foresees no 12 13 likelihood of a change in this trend.

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
