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This bill facilitates the reconstruction of Maine's indigenous hydro energy resources.

The Androscoggin Reservoir Company, which is owned by Union Water Power Company (a wholly-owned subsidiary of Central Maine Power Company), International Paper Company, Public Service Company of New Hampshire, Rumford Falls Power and Light Company (a wholly-owned subsidiary of Boise Cascade Paper Company), and James River Company, proposes to install new power generating facilities at its dam at Aziscoos Falls. The electricity produced will be sold to Central Maine Power Company, displacing oil-fired gener-This bill allows the project to comply with the provisions of the permit issued by the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission for development of the hydroelectric potential and allow an economic development through flow diversions of the Magalloway River as provided in the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission permit issued to Androscoggin. This bill removes the original charter prohibition against decreasing the flow in the river below the natural low-water flow.

In addition, the bill removes the prohibition against the export of electricity produced at Aziscoos beyond Maine's borders. An identical prohibition has recently been declared unconstitutional by the United States Supreme Court. New England Power Company v. New Hampshire, 455 U.S. 331 (1982).

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
