The Secretary of State shall restrict the operation of such motorized invalid chairs to those streets and highways and hours of the day as will, in his judgment, minimize the danger of injury to the operator. Section 2122 2502 shall not apply to such invalid chairs but the Secretary of State shall not issue such registration unless he is satisfied that such chair is equipped with an adequate stopping and holding device and means of giving audible signal.

- 1. State vehicles. All state-owned vehicles shall be registered by the Secretary of State, but shall be exempt from this Title as to the payment of registration fees, but shall not be exempt from the inspection requirements of section 2122 2502. Plates for the vehicles shall be of a design determined by the Secretary of State and shall expire at the end of each 6-year semipermanent plate program. The vehicles may, in addition, display a marker or insignia, approved by the Secretary of State, plainly designating them as state-owned.
 - A. Motor vehicles used by departments, commissions or agencies charged by law with law enforcement or investigatory functions, if used for those purposes by personnel who have full-time law enforcement or investigatory duties, shall not be required to display a special registration plate if the Commissioner of Public Safety so authorizes for he shall be the approving authority for all unmarked vehicles except those used by the Attorney General or members of his staff. Records of all unmarked vehicles shall be designated and held confidential.

Any person required to take an examination to qualify him to operate a motor vehicle shall pay an examination fee to the Secretary of State prior to such examination being given. Section 2 changes the law from 6 months to 30 days before a registration expires and can be reissued.
Section 3 changes the fee to register an antique motor vehicle from \$7.50 to \$10.
Section 4 removes the inspection requirement for a motorized wheelchair.
Sections 5 and 6 place state vehicle inspection requirements under the appropriate section in the inspection law, and place municipally-owned fire department vehicles under the appropriate section of the inspection law.
Section 7 makes specific the type of photo-picture to be placed on an operator's license.
19 Section 8 makes clear that both males and females 20 may donate organ parts upon their deaths.
Section 9 updates the lapsed license examination requirements to conform to the 4-year license laws. The current law applies to 2-year licenses.
