17 AN ACT to Clarify the Laws Relating to
18 Schools of Barbering and Schools of
19 Cosmetology.

21 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
22 follows:

23 Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §9505, as enacted by PL 1983,
24 c. 841, §6, is amended to read:

25 §9505. Regulation of schools of barbering and
26 schools of cosmetology

27 The commissioner shall adopt rules for the li-
28 censing of persons to maintain and operate schools of
29 barbering and schools of cosmetology, and for the li-
30 censing of persons offering instruction in barbering
31 and cosmetology to apprentices, which shall include
32 standards relating to educational programs, instruc-
33 tor qualifications and physical facilities. An annu-
34 al fee not to exceed \$500 shall be charged to the
35 schools for the cost of that regulation, except that

1 no such fee may be required for licenses issued to
2 persons offering instruction to apprentices.

3 Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §1551, sub-§5, as amended by PL
4 1983, c. 841, §16, is further amended to read:

5 5. Apprentice cosmetologist. "Apprentice cosme-
6 tologist" means any person who is engaged in learning
7 and acquiring a knowledge of the practice of cosme-
8 tology under the direction and supervision of a per-
9 son licensed under this chapter to practice cosmetol-
10 ogy ~~in accordance with the rules of the board relat-~~
11 ~~ing to apprentices.~~

12 STATEMENT OF FACT

13 Currently, the Department of Educational and Cul-
14 tural Services has the authority to promulgate rules
15 with respect to the conduct and operation of schools
16 of barbering and cosmetology. This bill authorizes
17 the department to likewise promulgate minimum re-
18 quirements for instructing apprentices in barbering
19 and cosmetology, including safety and sanitary re-
20 quirements. This authority was overlooked in the en-
21 actment of Public Law 1983, chapter 841.
