3 Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §1551, sub-§5, as amended by PL 4 1983, c. 841, §16, is further amended to read:

5 5. Apprentice cosmetologist. "Apprentice cosme-6 tologist" means any person who is engaged in learning 7 and acquiring a knowledge of the practice of cosme-8 tology under the direction and supervision of a per-9 son licensed under this chapter to practice cosmetol-10 ogy in accordance with the rules of the board relat-11 ing to apprentices.

STATEMENT OF FACT

13 Currently, the Department of Educational and Cultural Services has the authority to promulgate rules 14 with respect to the conduct and operation of schools 15 of barbering and cosmetology. This bill authorizes 16 the department to likewise promulgate minimum re-quirements for instructing apprentices in barbering and cosmetology, including safety and sanitary re-17 18 19 quirements. This authority was overlooked in the en-20 actment of Public Law 1983, chapter 841. 21

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
