3 STATE OF MAINE 4 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 5 112TH LEGISLATURE 6 FIRST REGULAR SESSION COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " \mathbf{A} " to H.P. 74, L.D. 95, 7 "Resolve, Creating a Joint Select Committee on Eco-8 9 nomic Development." 10 Amend the resolve by striking out everything af-11 ter the title and inserting in its place the follow-12 ing: 13 'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves 14 the Legislature do not become effective until 90 of 15 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; 16 and 17 Whereas, the role of the Federal Government with 18 respect to the several states and the economies of 19 these states is changing rapidly which has a great 20 impact upon economic development in each state; and 21 Whereas, the several states are taking 22 initiatives of their own to promote economic growth 23 and development which has a significant impact upon 24 all the states, in general; and 25 Whereas, there exists within the State signifi-26 cant opportunities for economic growth and development, particularly as a result of the attitudes and 27 work ethics of Maine's labor force, the attractive-28 29 ness of Maine's environment, the structure of Maine

32 Whereas, in order to realize economic growth and 33 development consistent with the small business struc-34 ture of the Maine economy, the assets of the State 35 and the needs and wants of Maine people, it is neces-36 sary to determine the most effective means to accom-37 plish this end; and

businesses and the enterprising nature of Maine peo-

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ple; and

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1 Whereas, there are a number of economic develop-2 ment organizations in numerous activities that have a 3 substantial impact upon economic development in 4 Maine; and

5 Whereas, it is necessary for the State to invest 6 prudently and efficiently in the promotion and en-7 couragement of economic growth and development in or-8 der to realize the State's economic potential; and

9 Whereas, State Government has limited resources 10 to invest in the promotion and encouragement of eco-11 nomic growth and development; and

12 Whereas, it is essential for a study committee to 13 begin as soon as possible to examine the issues raised by the changing role of the Federal Govern-14 ment, competition of other states in economic devel-15 opment, the diverse activities of the several econom-16 17 ic developments and other agencies of the State and 18 the State's limited resources for investment in economic growth and development; and 19

20 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, 21 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of 22 the Constitution of Maine and require the following 23 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-24 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 25 therefore, be it

26 Joint Select Committee on Economic Development; 27 established. Resolved: That the Joint Select Com-28 mittee on Economic Development, referred to as the 29 committee, is established to consist of the following 30 15 persons: Five members appointed by the President 31 of the Senate, of whom 4 may be Senators and 2 of whom shall be members of the Joint Standing Committee on State Government, and at least one person who 32 33 represents the private sector; 5 members appointed by 34 the Speaker of the House of Representatives, of whom 35 4 may be Representatives and 3 of whom shall be 36 se-

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1 lected from the Joint Standing Committee on State 2 Government, and at least one person who represents 3 the private sector; and 5 members appointed by the 4 Governor of whom 2 members represent State Government 5 and 3 members represent the private sector; and be it 6 further

7 Resolved: That members of the committee, includ-8 ing Legislators and excepting representatives of ex-9 ecutive agencies or departments, be paid a per diem 10 at the same rate as Legislators, as defined in the 11 Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2. Legisla-12 tors serving on the committee shall not be paid a per 13 diem for committee meetings while the Legislators are 14 collecting legislative per diem; and be it further

15 Resolved: That members representing the private 16 sector shall be paid at a rate normally paid to state 17 employees for expenses, including travel, meals and 18 lodging for meetings and hearings of the committee. 19 Legislative members of the committee shall be paid 20 expenses, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, 21 Title 3, section 2, for meetings and hearings held 22 outside Augusta while the Legislature is in session. 23 When the Legislature has adjourned, the legislative 24 members shall be paid the statutorily defined ex-25 penses for meetings and hearings held in or outside 26 Augusta. Members representing executive agencies or 27 departments shall be paid expenses from the budget of 28 the agency or department that the members represent; 29 and be it further

30 Resolved: That the committee undertake the fol-31 lowing tasks but shall not be limited to these tasks:

32 1. A study of the Maine economy to determine:

A. The most effective role for State Government
 in economic growth and development;

1 C. The needs of small business in Maine, partic-2 ularly capital availability on reasonable terms 3 and at reasonable rates; and

4 D. The need for advocacy of small business in 5 the State;

6 2. The changing role of the Federal Government, 7 the current impact of this changing role on the Maine 8 economy and possible impacts in the Maine economy in 9 the future;

10 3. The economic development activities under-11 taken directly or sponsored by state governments in 12 other states; and

4. An analysis showing how the State compares
with other states with respect to economic development promotion and encouragement; and be it further

16 Resolved: That the chairmen of the Joint Stand-17ing Committee on State Government, shall serve as 18 chairmen of the committee and shall call the first 19 meeting no later than 10 days following the appoint-20 ment of 10 members of the committee. At the first meeting, the committee shall develop an approach and 21 22 schedule by which the purpose and issues as set а forth in this order may be achieved and determine the 23 location of each hearing held to obtain information 24 25 for the formulation of an economic development strategy and economic development goals and objectives; and be it further 26 27

28 Resolved: That the committee hold a minimum of 4 29 hearings throughout the State at a time convenient to 30 the public to obtain information for an economic de-31 velopment strategy and for economic development goals 32 The committee may hold and objectives for Maine. 33 hearings in a manner deemed practicable to submit proposals to the public for public evaluation; and be 34 35 it further

1 **Resolved:** That the State Planning Office shall 2 provide technical assistance to the committee to in-3 clude data and data analysis, the time and services 4 of an economist, computer services and any other in-5 formation or services deemed necessary by the joint 6 select committee; and be it further

7 Resolved: That all other agencies and depart-8 ments of State Government shall cooperate with the 9 committee and shall expeditiously provide the commit-10 tee with the information and materials that it needs; 11 and be it further

12 **Resolved:** That the committee may contract for 13 services within the constraints of its budget; and be 14 it further

15 Resolved: That the Legislative Council shall al-16 locate from the Legislative Account, money deemed sufficient by the council to achieve the purposes of 17 18 this resolve. The Legislative Administrative Direc-19 tor, at each scheduled meeting except public hear-20 ings, shall provide the committee with an account of 21 the money expended by the committee and the remaining 22 money available for use by the committee up to the 23 date of each meeting. Members of the committee shall 24 submit their vouchers of expenses no later than 2 25 weeks from the date the expense is incurred in order 26 to qualify for reimbursement; and be it further

27 Resolved: That the Legislative Council shall 28 provide a minimum of one person to help staff the 29 committee; and be it further

Resolved: That the committee make its final re port including recommended legislation to the 112th
 Legislature on February 3, 1986.

33 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited 34 in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when 35 approved.' COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "R" to H.P. 74, L.D. 95

STATEMENT OF FACT

2 The purpose of this amendment is to establish а 15-member joint select committee to study the Maine 3 economy to determine the most effective role for State Government in economic development, the needs of small business to include capital availability and 4 5 6 7 the need for advocacy of small business in the State. In addition, this committee will look at the changing 8 9 role of the Federal Government and the activities of 10 other states in economic development.

11 This amendment changes the composition of the 12 joint select committee as compared to the resolve in 13 only one manner. Of the total membership of Legisla-14 tors on the select committee, 5 will be selected from 15 the Joint Standing Committee on State Goverment. The 16 chairmen of the joint standing committee shall serve 17 as cochairmen of the select committee.

18 This amendment also directs the State Planning 19 Office to provide to the select committee technical 20 assistance, including data and data analysis, the 21 time and services of an economist, computer services 22 and other information as required by the select com-23 mittee.
