The same benefit rights and protection shall apply to beneficiaries under the survivor benefit program and beneficiaries of former employees as are outlined in this subsection.

8 If, after a review of the actuary of the Maine State Retirement System, it is determined that 9 10 additional funds are required to finance in full the accrued retirement benefits for those employ-11 ees, then the actuary shall estimate the amount 12 of additional funds necessary to provide full re-13 14 tirement benefits for the period prior to July 1, 15 1976, and the appropriate counties shall provide funds necessary to fulfill this obligation from 16 the retirement allowance funds of the respective 17 18 counties.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

20 On July 1, 1976, pursuant to Public Law 1975, 21 chapters 383 and 408, employees of the Superior 22 Court, formerly county employees, became state employees involuntarily and members of the Maine State Retirement System. When eligible for the retirement, 23 24 25 these members will receive separate retirement benefits from the county for their creditable service as county employees and from the Maine State Retirement 26 27 System for their creditable service as state employ-28 ees. This bill allows them retirement benefits as if 29 all their creditable time had been as 30 state employ-31 ees.
