19	A voter who registers and votes under section 246
20	in a municipality outside his representative dis-
21	trict, state senatorial district or county, may vote
22	for the offices of Representative to the Legislature,
23	State Senator or any county office by using a ballot
24	obtained under this section.
25	1. Clerk to notify. The clerk of a municipality
26	in which voters have registered or enrolled under
27	section 246 shall notify the Secretary of State of
28	those registrations and enrollments at least 120 days
29	before any election.
30	2. Secretary of State to furnish ballots. The
31	Secretary of State shall provide to the clerk at
32	least 75 ballots for every 50 votes cast at that vot-
33	ing place by persons registered or enrolled under
34	section 246 in the last election of that type. These

These ballots shall contain the 13 14 names of the nominees or candidates for offices 15 in the electoral divisions in which the voters 16 reside.
- 17 STATEMENT OF FACT

18 This bill amends the election laws to allow town-19 ship residents who register and vote in a municipali-20 ty outside of their electoral districts to retain the 21 votes for offices in those districts. It permits 22 voters who are accustomed to voting in a convenient 23 place outside of their district to continue voting 24 there without being disenfranchised for some offices or severely inconvenienced by being forced to travel miles out of their way. The bill encourages voting 25 26 27 by these persons by allowing them to vote in a conve-28 nient place for the offices that concern them most.

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
