21 22	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
23 24	<b>20-A MRSA §11608, sub-§3,</b> as enacted by PL 1981, c. 693, §§5, 8, is amended to read:
25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32	3. <u>Maine public post-secondary institutions;</u> <u>grant allocation.</u> The department may allocate up to 25% 30% of the state student incentive scholarship grants to eligible students attending the University of Maine, <u>Maine Maritime Academy and the Maine</u> <u>vocational-technical institutes</u> . The balance of funds shall be granted to eligible students attending other institutions of higher education.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

2 Current statutory provisions require inclusion of 3 Maine Maritime Academy and the Maine the 4 vocational-technical institutes, within a group of 5 institutions which are almost totally private. As 6 the scholarship program awards are computed based on 7 the institutions' cost of attendance and as private institution costs are higher than those of public in-8 9 stitutions, those eligible students attending the academy and the vocational-technical institutions 10 11 could be prohibited from receiving an award. Includ-12 ing these institutions within the group presently consisting only of the University of Maine will allow 13 14 eligible students attending all Maine public institu-15 tions to have an equal opportunity to be considered 16 for an award.
