wage is increased in excess of \$3.55 per hour, the minimum wage established under this section shall be increased to the same amount, effective on the same date as the increase in the highest federal minimum wage, but in no case shall the minimum wage exceed \$4 per hour. The overtime provision of this section shall not apply to seamen, the canning, processing, preserving, freezing, drying, marketing, storing, packing for shipment or distribution of herring as sardines, of perishable foods, of agricultural produce and meat and fish products, nor to the canning of perishable goods, nor to hotels, motels, restaurants and other eating establishments, nor to salesmen.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill conforms Maine law to the federal law, which exempts automobile salesmen and mechanics who work on a flat rate basis from overtime provisions of federal law. This bill will also significantly ease administrative burdens on automobile dealerships.
