1 Whereas, tremendous potential exists for develop-2 ment of the fund during the spring and summer of 1985 3 and the subsequent provision of protection and public 4 access to Maine's outstanding rivers; and

5 Whereas, this opportunity will be lost if the 6 fund cannot be initiated during the spring or summer 7 of 1985; and

8 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, 9 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of 10 the Constitution of Maine and require the following 11 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-12 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 13 therefore,

14 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 15 follows:

- 16 12 MRSA §5015 is enacted to read:
- 17 §5015. Maine Rivers Protection Fund

18 There is established within the Department of 19 Conservation a Rivers Protection Fund, which shall be 20 funded by donations, bequests, grants, gifts and pro-21 ceeds from the sale of Maine rivers protection promo-22 tion items and shall be nonlapsing.

23 Pursuant to the authority established in section 24 5012, the commissioner may administer a state 25 grant-in-aid-program and may promulgate rules therefor under Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II. The 26 27 purpose of the program is to assist local governments and river conservation or management groups in activ-28 29 ities, including acquisition, furthering state poli-30 cies for the protection of and public access to the state's outstanding rivers. 31

32 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited 33 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when ap-34 proved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

2 The Act to promote the wise use and management of Maine's outstanding rivers, the 1983 Maine Rivers 3 Act, established a policy of recognition and protec-4 5 tion of the state's outstanding rivers or river seg-6 ments. The Department of Conservation, Bureau of Parks and Recreation, has identified 7 activities 8 which, if undertaken, will enhance the public enjoy-9 ment of these rivers.

10 This bill authorizes the department to collect 11 money from the sale of a decal or emblem and to ac-12 cept other donations for the purpose of making grants 13 to local governmental or other agencies concerned 14 with the protection of the values of these rivers for 15 specific activities which enhance public enjoyment of 16 this resource.

17 This bill creates a fund which will be capital-18 ized by donations and proceeds from the sale of a 19 Maine rivers identifying decal or emblem. Expendi-20 tures will not exceed the amount in the fund.

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
