in said commission shall be filled by appointment for the unexpired portion of the term in which such vacancy occurs. One member of the commission shall be designated by the Governor as chairman. sion shall adopt and have a seal and be provided with office at the State House in which its records shall be kept. The commission shall appoint an administrative director, a director of finance and a director of technical analysis. The director of techanalysis shall have a bachelor's degree in an appropriate field and 4 years' experience in engineering, or shall be registered as a professional engineer. Ιt shall appoint, with the approval of the Attorney General, a general counsel. All consumer assistance matters shall be under the supervisory authority of the general counsel. It shall appoint, subject to the Personnel Law, an assistant to the administrative director. The administrative director shall keep a full and minute record of the proceedings of the commission which shall be open to public inspection at all times. The assistant director shall assist the director in the performance of his duties, and in the absence of the director shall have the same powers as the director. The administrative director shall have authority to certify to all official acts of the commission, administer oaths, subpoenas and issue all processes, notices, orders or other documents necessary to the performance of the duties of the commission. The commission shall custody and control of all records, maps and papers pertaining to the offices of the former Board Railroad Commissioners and the former State Water Storage Commission.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to put the general counsel of the Public Utilities Commission in charge of consumer assistance matters which come before the Public Utilities Commission. This is to ensure that consumer assistance matters will be handled in conformity with current laws and procedures.

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
