- 3 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 4 follows:
- 5 21 MRSA §603, sub-§1, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1983, 6 c. 391, §1, is repealed and the following enacted in 7 its place:
- A. In a general election, the municipal officers in each municipality of 4,000 or more population 8 9 10 shall provide at least one voting booth for each 150, or fraction exceeding 1/2 thereof, of the 11 12 voters qualified to vote in each voting place. 13 In a municipality of less than 4,000 population, the municipal officers shall provide at least one 14 15 voting booth for each 200, or fraction exceeding 1/2 thereof, of the voters qualified to vote in each voting place. 16 17
- 18 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency 19 cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect 20 when approved.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

The intent of this bill is to revert back to the prior law in order to save unnecessary hardship and expense to the towns. Under this bill, a minimum number of booths is stipulated, but towns are given the option to add more if needed.

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
