10 11 12	Amend the bill in that part designated "§851." by striking out all of the first paragraph and inserting in its place the following:
13 14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24	'If a sheriff or deputy sheriff shall die as a result of injury received in line of duty, except white engaged in the duty of serving eivil process, his widew the spouse, or, if none, his minor child or children, shall receive a pension equal to 1/2 of the pay of such sheriff or deputy sheriff at the time of his death, but in no case shall such pension be less than \$1,000. Such pension shall be paid to the widew spouse until she the spouse dies or remarries and to a child or children until they die or reach the age of 18 years. This section shall also apply to deputy sheriffs who are not employed at regular salaries.'

26 27 28 29	This amendment clarifies language to make the bill apply to spouses of both sexes and to clarify that the original intent of the law was to give a pension to full-time and part-time deputy sheriffs.
