STATEMENT OF FACT

Presently, the vast majority of Maine's 12,000 fire fighters must train using makeshift facilities. The use of dilapidated buildings, telephone pole ladder towers and other stop-gap measures presents a potentially serious physical hazard to fire fighters and a liability hazard to the fire department. through its Fire Service Training Program, State, aids and supports local fire fighter training efforts. State support in the construction of safe, permanent, fire fighter training facilities is a logical and important extension of present efforts. \$40,000 a year state funding would yield over \$200,000 a year in training facilities construction statewide. A 5-year effort should upgrade facilities to acceptable levels.
