20 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as  
21 follows:

22 Appropriation. The following funds are appropri-  
23 ated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes  
24 of this Act.

STATEMENT OF FACT

2           The 111th Legislature authorized the Finance Au-  
3           thority of Maine to administer and fund an economic  
4           development program for low-income people. Under the  
5           provisions of the law, the Finance Authority of Maine  
6           is authorized to contract with community action agen-  
7           cies to administer preliminary review responsibili-  
8           ties at the local level for the loan program.

9           Due to a shortfall in the 1984-85 budget, only  
10          \$235,000 was appropriated by the 111th Legislature;  
11          for this reason 3 community action agencies were se-  
12          lected, by bid, on a pilot basis for local adminis-  
13          tration of the program. This appropriation brings  
14          the Job-start Revolving Loan Fund up to \$1,000,000,  
15          thus making funds available to applicants in all 12  
16          community action agencies served regions of the  
17          State.
