The result will either be to attract the better teachers away from the parochial school or place an added financial burden on the parochial school. Both events tend to weaken the parochial schools and shift students from the parochial to public systems. This shift will increase the demand for buildings and teachers in the public system and result in costs to the State that may exceed the cost of \$2,000 recognition grants to parochial school teachers.
23 24	For a fiscal note, the cost will equal \$2,000 times the number of eligible teachers.
