STATEMENT OF FACT

2 The Department of Marine Resources currently is 3 required to sell lobster measures to license holders. 4 Enforcement personnel must verify measure accuracy 5 prior to sale which is a time-consuming process which 6 detracts from ongoing duties. There are several pri-7 vate firms which provide measures for sale. The de-8 partment obtains from those sources and resells the 9 measures. This places the department in competition 10 with industry. Private firms can obtain certification of devices to assure accuracy of each measure, 11 12 making accurate measures available to industry. This 13 bill removes the requirement that the Department of 14 Marine Resources sell double gauge lobster measures 15 while providing that private industry may sell gauges 16 which can be verified for accuracy under state certi-17 fied procedures.

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
