A service fee of \$10 per cubic foot shall be levied on all low-level radioactive waste generated in this State and which is shipped to commercial disposal facilities or stored awaiting disposal at a low-level radioactive waste disposal facility. This service fee shall not apply to low-level radioactive waste which is authorized by the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission to be stored for decay on the site of generation or disposed without regard to radioactivity. The Board of Environmental Protection shall identify, by regulation, a list of those wastes which are exempt from		

1	the service fee, consistent with the intent of this
2	section. The revenue from this service fee shall be
3	credited to the fund established in subsection 1 and
4	used to carry out the purposes of this subchapter.
5	This service fee shall be levied only on low-level

STATEMENT OF FACT

The duties and responsibilities of the Low-level Waste Siting Commission and its support function within the Department of Environmental Protection are expected to continue beyond December 31, 1985. The Federal Government has delegated full responsibility for low-level radioactive waste management to the State effective in 1986.

Section 1 continues the Low-level Waste Siting Fund beyond December 31, 1985, by repealing the termination date currently in effect. New language also defines the service fee requirements more clearly and asks the Board of Environmental Protection to develop a rule which specifies which radioactive wastes are exempt from the service fee.
