Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act shall not be effective unless, within 60 days of the adjournment of the Legislature, the Secretary of State receives written certification by the governor and council of the Penobscot Nation that the nation has agreed to the provisions of this Act pursuant to the United States Code, Title 25, Section 1725(e) (1), copies of which shall be submitted by the Secretary of State to the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives, provided that in no event shall this Act become effective until 90 days after adjournment of the Legislature.

20 STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill changes the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30, section 6209, subsection 1, paragraph A, concerning the jurisdiction of the Penobscot Tribal
Court over offenses whose maximum imprisonment is not
over one year, as well as violation of the motor vehicle laws committed by nonmembers on the reservation.
