Sec. 2. Application. This Act shall be applied retroactively to any former member of the Maine Judicial Retirement System who is retired, to whom this section would have been applicable and who is living the effective date of this Act. Any member who, at the time he retired elected an optional retirement allowance, may elect to change his selection to provide a retirement allowance under the normal method of payment. If the former member was eligible to retire under the law in effect prior to December 1, 1984, this shall entitle his surviving spouse, who is the named beneficiary at the date of retirement to a retirement allowance which shall be equal to 1/2 of the amount being paid at the time of his death and which payment shall continue for the remainder of the surviving spouse's lifetime. If the former member was not eligible to retire under the prior law, but was 50 years of age or older on December 1, 1984, this shall entitle his surviving spouse, who is the named beneficiary at the date of retirement, to a retirement which shall be equal to a percentage of the

The percentage paid to the surviving spouse is set forth in a table in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 4, section 1375, subsection 1, paragraph B, subparagraph (2) and shall continue for the remainder of the surviving spouse's lifetime. The surviving spouse of any such former member who has died before the effective date of this Act shall be entitled to make that selection.
