8 STATEMENT OF FACT

The Maine Land Use Regulation Commission enforces timber harvesting standards within protection zones along streams in the unorganized areas. Not all of these streams are delineated on the commission's zoning maps, since many of the base maps were prepared before the availability of modern map making technology. Not knowing the location of some streams has repeatedly caused difficulties for both woods operators and the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission enforcement staff. A special forestry issues study committee has recommended that the commission's zoning maps be improved by using aerial photo interpretation to identify additional streams beyond those already on the zoning maps and by adding streams that have already been mapped by large landowners. funding provided by this bill allows the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission to verify the information on stream locations supplied by participating landowners and to map streams for other ownerships. Funding amounts are based on the assumption of maximum cooperation from large landowners to make their information on stream locations available to the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission.

It is estimated that a total of \$67,620 from the General Fund would be needed for this 2 year project. The Maine Land Use Regulation Commission does not have funds in its regular budget to cover this expense. No permanent positions would be created.
