statewide primary, general election, Columbus Day, the 2nd Monday in October; Veterans Day, November 11th; or on Christmas Day. The Chief Justice of the 1 2 3 4 Supreme Judicial Court may order that court be held 5 on a legal holiday when he finds that the interests 6 of justice and judicial economy in any particular 7 case will be served. The public offices in county buildings may be closed to business on the above-8 9 named holidays. When any one of the above-named holidays falls on Sunday, the Monday following shall be 10 observed as a holiday, with all the privileges apply-11 ing to any of the days above named. 12

## STATEMENT OF FACT

14 The purpose of this bill is to permit our state 15 courts to remain open on days on which there is a 16 statewide primary or general election.
